




Background: A Map of the Village of Roslyn as Seen in 1870

- E. Theodore Nelson (1897-1964) (né Einar Theodore Nilsson) was born in Brooklyn to Swedish parents and attended Brooklyn Manual High School.
- Nelson and his wife Catherine H. Nelson (1914-2008) worked out of their studio, The Nelson Studio, located in in St. James, New York.
- Together the Nelsons created historical pictorial maps of Long Island in the 1950s and 1960s including the villages of Roslyn, Port Washington, Sands Point and Manhasset, Valley Stream, East Hampton, Bridgehampton and Southampton.
- The maps were notable for their artistic format, while highlighting the significant buildings, residences and their owners.
- Each map was signed off by the Nelson: "Done from the old and musty records by Catherine and E. Theodore Nelson."







Mill Dam, Main Street, Papermill Road and East Broadway




Main Street (north), Mill Dam (old Northern Boulevard), East Broadway (north) and School Street (Old Northern Boulevard)




Paper Mill Road, Main Street (south), East Broadway (south)
